

VNC for Symbian

VNC stands for Virtual Network Computing. Which is, a remote display system which allows you to view a computing 'desktop' environment not only on the machine where it is running, but from anywhere on the Internet and from a wide variety of machine architectures.

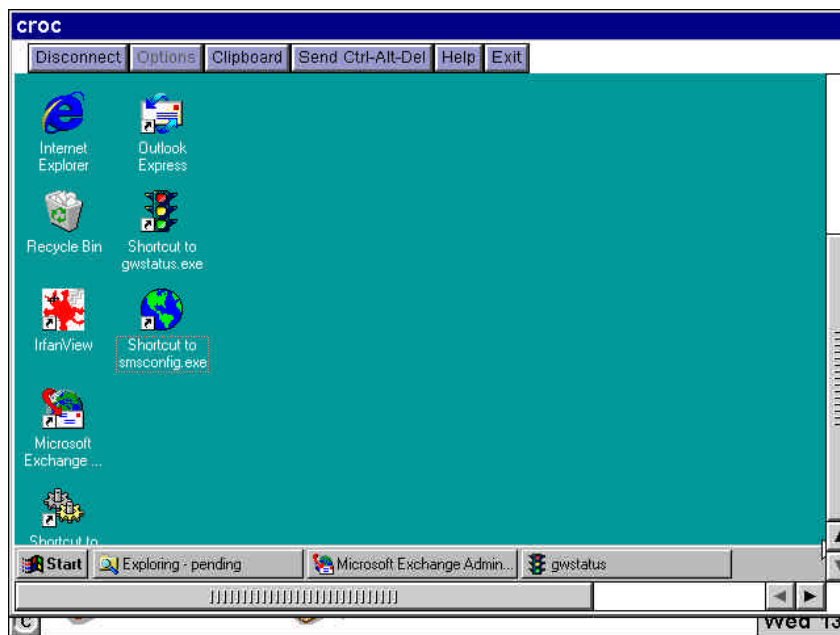
It is possible, for example, use a VNC viewer running on a PC on the desktop to display the screens from servers based in a remote computer room.

Imhotek have taken the Java source code for VNC, and from this created an installer package for Symbian based systems.

Additional features include

- Addition of scroll-bars
- Addition of help window for Symbian instructions
- Changes to login screen, to enable password to be entered at the same time as the server details
- The ability to store a number of server profiles in a configuration file
- The ability to hide the button bar, for maximum screen size

Server Requirements

The server to which you are connecting must be running the VNC server software.

Client Requirements

VNC for Symbian works on all Symbian platforms:

- EPOC release 5 devices: Psion Revo, 5mx, 7 and netBook
- EPOC release 6 devices: Nokia 9210

NOTE: All platforms require the Java Virtual Machine, which is either pre-installed or available on the CD that accompanies the Symbian device.
